Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for the Hartford Alternative Education School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Hartford Alternative Education School has not been given one of these labels.

There are several key challenges that we are focusing on. First, we are working to eliminate barriers for students. Next, we are working to align our curriculum to

match state standards. Finally, we are focusing on improving students' proficiency in all subject areas.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL – Hartford Alternative Education works with at-risk youth and adults to help them obtain their high school diploma or GED. We utilize Odysseyware courseware to provide the curriculum.

6. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES – We have an open door policy for parents to come by or call with any questions or concerns. We also offer scheduled times for parent/teacher conferences.

After review and restructuring Hartford Alternative Education, our goal is to break down some of the barriers that keep our students from fulfilling their educational goals. We look forward to a great future.
