The Southwest Michigan Community School has not made Adequate Yearly Progress as an alternative school; the majority of the students have not been proficient in mathematics or reading. The students who attend this site have had poor academic success and displayed less than satisfactory attendance.

The Southwest Community School is designed to provide educational opportunities that permit adults and At-Risk youth to enrich their lives, promote the development of a positive self-image, advance their careers, and reach their potential. The students have different styles. Southwest Michigan Community School tries to meet the educational needs of the individual who attends the program. The program works to promote a stable educational environment that invites the student to join and attend on a regular basis. Attendance is an issue for most of the students, the student who attends on a regular basis has a greater opportunity for academic success. To become proficient in mathematics and reading, students work on the skills needed to improve in the two areas. The TABE assessment, ACT/MME for Juniors, Plan assessment for 10th graders provide some information concerning the academic growth of the students.
